### Impacts LASERS

### <u>SB 7 – Hodges</u> (Position: Oppose)

Systems Impacted: All

Requires third party service providers for public retirement systems to make investment decisions based solely on financial factors. The bill also sets limitations on proxy voting.

# Ms. Hutchinson moved, seconded by Ms. Mathews, to oppose SB 7. With no objection or discussion, the motion carried.

### HB 8 – Glorioso (Position: Neutral)

Systems Impacted: LASERS & MERS

Allows a member of MERS to retain membership in lieu of participation in LASERS.

### HB 9 – Bagley (Position: Support)

Systems Impacted: LASERS

Permits any rank-and-file member regardless of age or first date of employment, to retire with 30 years of service credit.

# HB 10 – Boyer (Position: Neutral)

Systems Impacted: LASERS

Present law provides an exception from return-to-work provisions for individuals appointed by the governor to fill an unclassified service position if they have at least 30 years of service credit. This bill reduces the number of years of service credit needed for P.O.S.T-certified law enforcement officers from 30 to 25.

# HB 63 – Green Constitutional Amendment

(Position: Neutral)

Systems Impacted: LASERS

Proposes a constitutional amendment that, if approved by voters at the Nov. 3, 2026, election, would remove mandatory retirement age (70) for judges and instead impose a mandatory retirement for judges who have attained one hundred percent of his final average compensation.

Makes the knowing and willful violation of the Open Meetings Law a crime.

# SB 8 – Morris Constitutional Amendment

Proposes a constitutional amendment that, if approved by voters on November 15, 2025, would make changes to the Civil Service Commission's membership, terms, and nomination process, and allow positions to be removed from the classified service by the legislature.
